

## BIOGRAPHY

MILTON O. "SKIP" WEBB, JR.

"Skip" Webb served in law enforcement for 46 years, beginning his career with the Raleigh, North Carolina Police Department as a police cadet in 1967. He joined the Army in 1968. In 1970 he was selected to serve as a Special Deputy US Marshall at the age of 22 and flew to over 57 countries as a Federal Sky Marshall protecting against high jacking on commercial aircraft. He became an accredited CID Special Agent in 1972, serving for over 42 years as a criminal investigator and Supervisory Special Agent. From 1974 until 1978, he served as a protective service "body guard" for two Secretaries of Defense and the Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve. He returned to North Carolina in 1978, serving as an agent with the Department of Crime Control and Public safety until his return to active duty in 1981. In 1986, he attended the DOD Polygraph Institute later serving as a CID polygraph examiner. He has served as a region polygraph supervisor, as a quality control supervisor and the military Chief of the Army CID Polygraph Division. Skip retired from active duty in 1994, accepting the position as a Supervisory Special Agent and Chief of the Polygraph Division, Army CID, responsible for worldwide supervision of all CID polygraph examiners. In 1998 he was promoted to Deputy Director, US Army Crime Records Center, CID. Skip holds a BA in criminal justice from Shaw University and a Master of Arts degree in management from Webster University. He is a graduate of the FBI Advanced Polygraph Studies Course, and the Department of Defense Polygraph Institute Supervisor's course. Skip is a three term past President of the American Polygraph Association and served three years as

its executive director and Chairman of the Board of Directors. Skip has served as an instructor for The US Army Judge Advocate General's School, the Drug Enforcement Agency, US Secret Service, the Central Intelligence Agency, The National Reconnaissance Office the DOD Polygraph Institute, Federal Inter-Agency Polygraph Seminars, numerous state association seminars and numerous APA Seminars as well as the Canadian Association of Police Polygraphists, The Israeli Polygraph Association and the Mexican Government's Security Service. He is a past president of the Maryland Polygraph Association and a past member of the Virginia association and a current member of the North Carolina Polygraph Association. He has published articles in both the A.P.A. and A.A.P.P. Journals and authored two Army Regulations and the CID Polygraph Policy and Procedures Manual. He grew up in Pinetops, NC and his wife Connie hails from Dunn, NC where they now make their home. Upon his retirement in October 2013, Skip started a private company, Webb Consulting & Training, LLC. He consults with attorneys in cases involving criminal matters and polygraph. He has testified as an expert witness in both federal and state courts. Skip is the US Polygraph Sales Representative for Limestone Technologies, Inc. and teaches polygraph both in the US and has done so in several foreign countries. He lectures on law enforcement and polygraph related subjects; conducts private polygraph examinations and trains intern polygraph examiners. In 2017, he was inducted into the Army Criminal Investigation Special Agent Hall of Fame.
